



In 2011, 63% of Schuler Scholars matriculated to schools that are Most Competitive, with 30% and 7% matriculating to Highly Competitive and Very Competitive schools respectively. The average selectivity (Princeton Review) of Schuler colleges has increased from 87 to 95 since 2007.
